MYANMAR HERITAGE (7N)

DAY 1 BAGAN (EMBARKATION) – SALAY (LUNCH/DINNER/WELCOME RECEPTION)

EMBARKATION

Board the Ship at Ayeyar Jetty 11:00 am and cast off 11:30 am, welcome cocktail in the saloon.

AFTERNOON EXCURSION: Salay

After Lunch, we walk ashore at Salay, a small town founded in the 13th century with Bagan-era shrines, beautiful 19th century teak monasteries and preserved British colonial buildings. We explore the Salay House, a restored 1906 colonial trading company warehouse on the bank of the Irrawaddy. Our walk takes us along the town's main Strand Street towards the local market before visiting the beautiful Yoke Soun Kyaung Taw Gyi wooden monastery. This ornately carved teak monastery was designed as a copy of the Crown Prince House of Mandalay, and is now a museum boasting remarkable wood carvings and artifacts. We pass some interesting Bagan-era monuments on our way to visit Mann Paya, a pagoda with a beautiful lacquerware Buddha, before returning to our ship. Dinner and moor overnight mid stream.

DAY 2 BAGAN (BREAKFAST/LUNCH/DINNER)

MORNING EXCURSION: Bagan

This morning our excursion takes us to one of the most incredible areas of Myanmar: Bagan. Once the center of the Pagan Empire, Bagan today is a tourist, artist, and archeological mecca. We will start the tour with Shwezigon Pagoda constructed during the reign of King Anawrahta and a Buddhist religious place. It is believed to enshrine a bone and tooth of Gautama Buddha. Then we proceed to the massive Htilominlo temple, built by King Htilominlo on the site where he was chosen to be the crown prince of Pagan. Htilominlo boasts the finest plaster carvings which still remain undamaged on the arch pediments. Then we stop by Thatbyinnyu Pagoda for photo shoot on the way back to ship for Lunch.

AFTERNOON EXCURSION: Bagan

After lunch, we visit Gubyaukgyi Temple, where the richly-colored paintings are thought to date to the early 12th century and we will also see a sand painting demonstration by a local artist. Next to this temple is the gilded Myazedi Stupa, which offers both a linguistic and a historical significance: an inscription consecrating Gubyaukgyi in four languages (Pyu, Mon, Old Burmese, and Pali), which established Pyu as an important cultural influence in the early Pagan period. A visit to Bagan would not be complete without exploring the famous Ananda temple. Built in 1105 CE during King Kyanzittha's reign, it is one of only four surviving temples

from this period. We will explore the cruciform of the temple, with four standing Buddhas facing north, south, east, and west. After that we stop by Dhammayan Gyi Pagoda for photo shoot. For our final stop of the day we proceed to the Bagan Viewing Hill where we will view the sunset over the pagodas and stupas of Bagan before returning to the ship.

DAY 3 BAGAN-RIVER VILLAGE (BREAKFAST/LUNCH/DINNER)

MORNING EXCURSION: Bagan

Explore some of Bagan's local markets selling wood carvings, fabric, longyis and rattan product. Visit a workshop to see the ancient technique of lacquer ware making. Alternatively, guests can hire a horse cart or a bicycle and explore the site on their own (or) have a splendid Balloon Flight over Bagan (surcharge applied – optional). Back to the ship around Noon and cast off.

AFTERNOON EXCURSION: River Village

We cruise upstream all day. Stop at River village for a walk. Dinner followed by a Puppet Show on the sundeck.

DAY 4 YANDABO

(BREAKFAST/LUNCH/DINNER)

MORNING EXCURSION: Yandabo

In the morning we arrive at Yandabo, a picturesque river village specializing in Pot-Making, where the peace treaty of the First Anglo-Burmese war signed on Feb. 24, 1826. We go ashore for a walking at some pot-making workshops and visit the monastery. We cruise upstream the rest of the day, moor overnight near Myin Mu.

DAY 5 MONYWA (BREAKFAST/LUNCH/DINNER)

FULL DAY EXCURSION: Monywa

Early morning drive by coach (approx. 1 ½ hours) to Monywa to visit the Hpowindaung cave where hundreds of Buddha Statues are placed inside niches decorated with wonderful mural paintings. Serve Lunch at local restaurant in Win Unity Hotel in Monywa. After lunch we visit the splendid Sambuddhai Kat Kyaw pagoda with its more than 500,000 Buddha images.

Drive back to Myin Mu and Overnight night at River bank.

DAY 6 AVA - SAGAING - AVA

(BREAKFAST/LUNCH/DINNER)

MORNING EXCURSION: Ava

Visit Ava by horse-cart visiting the beautiful 200 year old teak Bagaya Kyaung Monastery, Nanmyin watchtower (27mt. high) and the Me Nu Ok Kyaung monastery. Return to ship & sailing to Sagaing.

AFTERNOON EXCURSION: Sagaing - Amarapura

In the afternoon, we visit to Sagaing Hill, a hill studded with many Pagodas and Monasteries rich in wood carving and religious art. Then we travel by coach to Amarapura, the penultimate Burmese Royal Capital (1783) to visit a traditional silk weaving workshop followed by U-Bein Bridge, the world's longest wooden bridge (1.2 km) and enjoy the sunset there. Dinner and overnight on board near Sagaing Hill.

DAY 7 MINGUN - CENTRAL MANDALAY

(BREAKFAST/LUNCH/FAREWELL DINNER)

MORNING EXCURSION: Mingun

After breakfast we will enjoy a leisurely walking tour of the small town of Mingun. Our first stop is King Bodawpaya's monumental, uncompleted

stupa. During construction, an astrologer to the king argued that the king would die upon completion of the temple, and work was immediately halted. Had it been completed, it would have been the largest in the world. The cracks we see are the result of the 23 March 1839 earthquake that shook the area. We continue our walk to the Mingun Bell, which was the heaviest working bell in the world until 2000 when the Bell of Good Luck was unveiled in Henan, China. After having the opportunity to stand inside the bell as it is rung, we have time to shop in the local market, famous for its makeshift galleries that display inexpensive art from both local and internationally known artists. Lunch on board.

AFTERNOON: Central Mandalay

Visit central Mandalay: Mahamuni Pagoda, then visit to the workshops of gold leave making and marble carving. And visit to Kuthodaw Paya, which contains the world's biggest book, near by Mandalay Hill where spiraling staircases lead to sweeping views of the city and its temples and Sunset time at Mandalay Hill. Dinner on board. Overnight at Mandalay.

DAY 8 MANDALAY (DISEMBARK)

(BREAKFAST)

Morning disembark at Gawein Jetty around 9:00 am.

ROYAL MYANMAR (3N)

DAY 1 BAGAN (Embarkation) - RIVER VILLAGE (LUNCH/DINNER/WELCOME RECEPTION)

EMBARKATION

Board the ship at Aye Yar Jetty in Bagan at 10:30 AM and cast off 11:00 AM. Welcome cocktail and Lunch.

AFTERNOON EXCURSION: Salay

We cruise upstream all day. Stop at River village for a walk. Dinner followed by a Puppet Show on the sundeck.

DAY 2 YANDABO (BREAKFAST/LUNCH/DINNER)

MORNING EXCURSION: Yandabo

In the morning we arrive at Yandabo, a picturesque river village specializing in Pot-Making, where the peace treaty of the First Anglo-Burmese war signed on Feb. 24, 1826. We go ashore for a walking at some pot-making workshops and visit the monastery.

We cruise upstream the rest of the day, moor overnight near Myin Mu.

DAY 4 AVA - SAGAING (Disembarkation) (BREAKFAST/LUNCH)

MORNING EXCURSION: Ava

Nanmyin watchtower (27mt. high) and the Me Nu Ok Kyaung monastery. Return to ship & sailing to Sagaing.

FROM ROYAL MANDALAY TO ANCIENT BAGAN (2N)

DAY 1 MANDALAY (GAWEIN) – MINGUN (LUNCH/DINNER/WELCOME RECEPTION)

EMBARKATION

The embarkation time is 12.00 noon at Gawein jetty and cast off after half an hour time.

Welcome Cocktail and briefing in the Saloon or Sundeck followed by Lunch.

After cruising upstream for two hours we arrive at Mingun where we visit the impressive unfinished pagoda and the largest working bell in the world. Our English speaking manager (or your private guide) will accompany the guests during the visit.

Moor Overnight at a sandbank mid-stream. After dinner guests can enjoy a Dance and Drama performance by the Mandalay Arts School on the sundeck (if available).



DAY 2 MINGUN – SAGAING –YANDABO (BREAKFAST/LUNCH/DINNER)

MORNING EXCURSION: Sagaing

Early in the morning cruise downstream. During the two hours journey the passengers can admire the natural beauty of the river and the life of its banks while relaxing on the sundeck or just sitting outside their own cabin. Enjoy the sunrise over Sagaing Hill.

After breakfast passengers wishing to visit Sagaing can go ashore with the assistance of our Ship Manager or their own guide.

We resume our downriver voyage at 10.30 hrs and we will sail all day long.

AFTERNOON EXCURSION: Yandabo

we stop at Yandabo, a village specializing in Pot-Making, where the peace treaty of the First Anglo-Burmese war was signed on Feb. 24, 1826. We visit the Pot workshops, the monastery.

Moor overnight near the village of Shwe Nann Tint.

DAY 3 BAGAN (BREAKFAST)

Cast off early in the morning for the last leg of our journey Enjoy the sunrise near Bagan. Passengers will disembark at Aye Yar jetty around 9:30 hrs.

DAY 1 BAGAN – CRUISING TO MANDALAY (RIVER VILLAGE STOP) (LUNCH/DINNER/WELCOME RECEPTION)

EMBARKATION

The embarkation time is 11.30 hrs at Bagan Aye Yar jetty and cast off after half an hour.

Welcome Cocktail and briefing in the Saloon or Sundeck followed by

AFTERNOON EXCURSION: River Village

In the late afternoon stop in a typical river village.

DAY 2 CRUISING TO MANDALAY (VISIT YANDABO VILLAGE) (BREAKFAST/LUNCH/DINNER)

MORNING EXCURSION: Yandabo

Cruise all day with stop enroute in the morning to visit Yandabo, a typical river village specializing in Pot-Making, where the peace treaty of the First Anglo-Burmese war was signed on Feb. 24, 1826. We visit the Pot workshops, the monastery.

Moor overnight nearby a village (Ywar Thit Gyi or Pauk Myaing Pauk Taw) few miles away from Ava Bridge.

DAY 3 BAGAN

(BREAKFAST)

Enjoy the sunrise. After an early breakfast, the passengers will disembark at Sagaing Jetty (Thursday only) or Gawein jetty (Sunday Only) at around



BETWEEN ROYAL MANDALAY & ANCIENT BAGAN (1N)

DAY 1 MANDALAY (SAGAING) – YANDABO (LUNCH/DINNER/WELCOME RECEPTION)

The embarkation time is 10.00 hrs at SAGAING jetty and cast off after half an hour.

Welcome Cocktail and briefing in the Saloon or Sundeck followed by lunch.

Cruise all day long. In the late afternoon we stop at Yandabo, a village specializing in Pot-Making, where the peace treaty of the First Anglo-Burmese war was signed on Feb. 24, 1826. We visit the Pot workshops, the monastery.

Moor overnight near the village of Shwe Nann Tint.






DAY 2 BAGAN (BREAKFAST/LUNCH/DINNER)

Early in the morning we continue downstream to Bagan. After breakfast (if time permits) we visit another typical river village. Enjoy the sunrise near Bagan. Passengers will disembark at Bagan Aye Yar jetty by 9:30 hrs.

EXPEDITION CRUISES



DAY 1 BAGAN – PAKKOKU (LUNCH/DINNER/WELCOME RECEPTION)

Board the ship at 09.00 hrs. We cast off at 09.30 hrs and sail upstream to the Irrawaddy and the Chindwin confluence. If time permits we stop in Thein Gone, a typical river village where we visit the school and the monastery. We continue cruising north to the bustling town of Pakkoku where we visit the monastery, cheroots and weaving workshops. We pass the Chindwin and Irrawaddy river confluence and we stop for the night.

DAY 2 PAKKOKU - PAKHAN-GYI - AHMYINT - MONYWA (BREAKFAST/LUNCH/DINNER)

Visit the little town of Pakhan-gyi. This post-Pagan period provincial capital was walled with a moat and originally had a governor's palace. We see the old walls; visit the museum and a spectacular 19th century wood carved monastery.

We continue cruising to Ahmyint village and visit the local market, where we can see beautiful houses and the lovely 17th century style Min Kyaw Swa stupas with 18th century style paintings.

Arrive at Monywa, the Chindwin River largest port, in the early evening.

DAY 3 MONYWA (HPOWINDAUNG CAVES) (BREAKFAST/LUNCH/DINNER)

We visit Hpowindaung Caves where hundreds of Buddha Statues are placed inside niches decorated with wonderful mural paintings. Late lunch and cast off.

DAY 4 KANI

(BREAKFAST/LUNCH/DINNER)

Late morning explore the village of Kanee and climb the pagoda hillock for its view. We continue sailing upstream until late at night to reach the village of Kani.

DAY 5 KIN – MINGIN (BREAKFAST/LUNCH/DINNER)

Early morning we explore Kin village with its beautiful wooden houses and the woodcarvings monastery. Continue sailing upstream to the small enchanting town of Mingin. Explore its temples and 1900's wooden houses and the Min Kyaung Monastery with old Buddha Images.



DAY 6 KYIDAW

(BREAKFAST/LUNCH/DINNER)

At Kyidaw (Kyi Taung Oo) we visit Shwe Za War Yaw monastery one of the oldest and best preserved wood carved monastery of Myanmar, embellished with wooden sculpted idols with fascinating gold leaf wall decorations. We walk through a beautiful scenario of paddy fields to the village of Kan where we visit another splendid example of Myanmar old monastery. Afterwards we return to the ship by local boat.


Proceed upstream up to Kyaw Zin, a village very close to Kalewa, where we stop for the night.

DAY 7 KALEWA

(BREAKFAST/LUNCH/DINNER)

In the morning we explore Kalewa, the main river port for the trading with India, the lively market and climb up to Shwe Moat Htaw stupa for the beautiful view.

Back to the ship before lunch and keep on cruising upstream to Mawlaik.



DAY 8 MAWLAIK – SAILING BACK DOWNSTREAM (BREAKFAST/LUNCH/DINNER)

Mawlaik (situated 35 km from the Indian Border) was the administrative capital of this area rich of Teak forests. It is a pleasant colonial town with its golf course surrounded by splendid colonial houses built by the Bombay Burmah Trading Corporation in the 1920's and 1930's (there is still a small community of Indians that used to work for the Scottish company and their descendents). The governor's house, the administrative building, the school, the hospital, the "Dak Bungalows", company headquarter are well preserved, still in use nowadays and nicely maintained.

Being this our turnaround point, we begin sailing back downstream to Monywa.

DAY 9 SAILING DOWNSTREAM FOR 100 MILES (BREAKFAST/LUNCH/DINNER)

Continue sailing all day downstream. Stop at a typical River village, famous for its Petrified Wood, where we visit the school and the typical houses.




DAY 10 YANDABO (BREAKFAST/LUNCH/DINNER)



Although the vessel does not offer directdial calls from their suites while on board, in the event of an emergency, the Reception Desk can facilitate an international call, and associated costs will be billed to the guest's onboard account.

The RV Paukan 2015 contact information will be included in final travel documents, and may be provided as a contact number in the event of an emergency at home.

Onboard Account & Currency

The official currency on board is the US Dollar. All charges for services and products on board will be placed on the guest's shipboard account to be settled at the end of the voyage. MasterCard, Visa and US dollars are also accepted for the settlement of guest accounts.

Dietary Requirements

Our culinary team will make every effort to accommodate special dietary requests. Please inform our office at least 60 days prior to departure of these requests.

Electricity

The electrical current on board is 220V. For those items that are dual voltage, suites are outfitted with a multi-plug configuration feature. Guests should be sure to bring the appropriate converter for devices that are not dual voltage.

Fitness Centre

The RV Paukan 2015 is equipped with state-of-the-art fitness equipment. Guests may enjoy panoramic views of the Irrawaddy River while enjoying the Fitness Center, located on the Sun Deck.

Gratuities

Gratuities are a personal matter, and are a token of your appreciation for a job well done. Envelopes will be provided en-suite on the last night of your sailing. US dollars are the preferred currency, however guests may also charge gratuities on their shipboard account, which may be settled with a credit card at the end of the voyage. Suggested gratuities are \$10 per person per day for shipboard staff and crew, \$6 per person per day for tour guides, and \$3 per person per day for Cruise Director.

Laundry Service

Twenty-four hour, professional laundry and pressing service is provided on board. Costs will be listed in each suite's directory, and charged to the guest's account.

Mail

Our Reception Desk staff would be pleased to mail postcards upon request. Applicable postage costs will be charged to the guest's account.

Medical Services

The RV Paukan 2015 staff is trained in first aid, and we are never far from on-shore medical services. Guests requiring oxygen for medical reasons are welcome to bring their own equipment, as required. Guests must bring the appropriate electric converter for personal medical equipment.

Unfortunately, we are unable to accommodate pets of any kind aboard the RV Paukan 2015.

Spa Services

The Paukan Spa offers a range of spa treatments from well-trained, professional, spa staff. A menu of services is available on board, and all costs associated with spa services will be charged to the guest's account.

Shore Excursions

All shore excursions during your 9-night cruise aboard the Irrawaddy Explorer are included in your cruise tariff.

Excursions are led by expert guides, and guests are divided into two groups, guaranteeing there are never more than 28 passengers touring together. Electronic listening devices are complimentary to all guests in order to ensure that guests are able to hear their guides, even in crowded areas.

Smoking

The comfort and safety of our guests is our first priority. Smoking is not permitted in the suites or enclosed, public areas on board. There is a designated smoking area on the Sun Deck.
